

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

Board Policy

Non-resident students may be accepted as tuition students if space is available and an appropriate program can be provided. Admission is subject to review of the educational records of the students. Transportation is the responsibility of the parent in cases of personal tuition. School districts of residence are responsible for transportation to special education programs. The contract must be renewed annually and the payment of tuition is set annually.

Students whose parents have moved from the district may complete the semester without payment of tuition.

A waiver of tuition may be requested for students whose family intends to move into the school district within the first nine weeks of the semester. The parent must accept responsibility for any required transportation.

Tuition payment may be waived for students who live with a relative or non-relative and whose parents live out of the school district. A notarized affidavit assigning responsibility must be provided to the relative who is a resident of the school district. The affidavit must be submitted to the Superintendent of Schools. The affidavit must indicate that the relative or non-relative must be primarily responsible for the care and actions of the student as if he/she were the parent.

The purpose for which the student who is living with a relative or non-relative must be primarily for a reason other than to partake of the educational facilities of the district.

Non-resident students shall have all the rights and privileges of resident students and shall be subject to the same rules and regulations.

Non-resident students shall abide by WIAA eligibility rules for athletic participation. (Article XXII-WIAA Bylaws).

Students from foreign countries who participate in recognized programs may attend the School District of Bonduel without payment of tuition or book rental.

Recognized Foreign Exchange Programs:

1. Have stated educational goals compatible with the educational goals of the School District of Bonduel.
2. Are supported by a local or state organization with a contract person available as a resource to school personnel and the host family.
3. Have the endorsement of the United States Department of State.
4. Have a complete financial report available to the public.
5. Provide adequate assistance to the student during his exchange experience.
6. Examples are American Field Service, People to People, Sister City and Rotary International Youth Exchange. Other agencies wishing to become a district recognized foreign exchange program should seek recognition from the Superintendent of Schools.

No person may be denied admission to any public school or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil services, recreational or other program or activity because of the person's sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability.
