

Interscholastic and Extracurricular Activities

Interscholastic and extracurricular activities are an integral part of the curriculum. Interscholastic and extracurricular activities provide opportunities and have definite goals which include:

1. Teaching students to make and accept decisions, discipline, and responsibilities.
2. Providing activities for learning self-discipline, loyalty, team play, personal pride, pride in the organization, and respect for the rights of others.

All full-time students within each building are eligible to participate in student organizations and activities of that building. Eligibility requirements for participation in organizations or activities will be established by the building principal, athletic director, and advisor or coach; will meet WIAA standards where applicable; and will be approved by the Board.

Interscholastic and extracurricular organizations and activities are established by the Board for the purpose of meeting educational objectives and philosophy of the district. The Board may suspend or disband any interscholastic or extracurricular organizations which fail to meet the district’s educational objectives or comply with the district’s educational philosophy.

The District shall not discriminate on the basis of sex, race national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
