



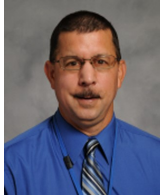

Bonduel Elementary School "Significantly Exceeds Expectations!"



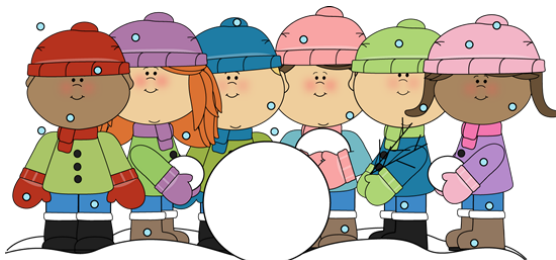

Recess Reminders:

Students are not permitted to stay indoors, except at their teacher's request, during recess time without a written request from a physician or a written request from the parent on the day after a prolonged illness. Exceptions may be allowed upon consultation with the principal. Please do not request that your child be excused from recess or physical education except in emergencies. Ordinarily, a child who is well enough to be in school is well enough to play at recess and engage in physical education activities. Students have recess before/ after lunch, and in the afternoon.

- We will hold indoor recess when the air temperature and/or wind chill factor is below zero.
- Jackets, hats and mittens, boots, and snow pants should be brought to school every day.
- When snow is on the ground, students are expected to wear all winter gear.

Native American Heritage Month Comes to a Close

-1st and 2nd grade Team

Mrs. Schwitzer shared her Menominee heritage this week with the first and second grade classes by doing presentations and crafts. She gave an overview of what a Native American is, where her tribe's territory was/is now, and also shared the Menominee creation story. She explained that the Menominee Crane clan were mainly artists. She shared knowledge about Native beaders, showed different types of beads and her collection of beaded jewelry. The first graders all created a pony bead necklace!

The second grade presentation was focused on applique, a floral design often found on ribbon skirts and regalia. The students made their own unique applique based on flowers and plants they see in our area. Mrs. Schwitzer also shared the 4 sacred plants with the students: cedar, sage, sweet grass, and tobacco bundles. Waewaenen to Mrs. Schwitzer for taking the time educate our students and honor Native American Heritage Month.
