

FOOD SERVICES MANAGEMENT

The school lunch program is an integral part of the total education program, and as such shall be governed by the same policies and rules that apply to all other areas of the school operation.

The district shall provide lunches through participation in the National School Lunch Program. The District Administrator shall enter into an agreement with the Department of Public Instruction and the federal government for participation in such child nutrition programs.

The school lunch program will:

1. Be operated in all schools with suitable facilities on a nonprofit basis;
2. Meet federal regulations and be available to all students.
3. Provide free and reduced price lunches to eligible students who apply and who qualify under federal income

The Food Service Director is responsible for the management of the school lunch program, including the purchase of food, menu preparation, and supervision of cooks, assistant cooks and helpers.

The School Board will set and approve prices for school lunches and milk.

The School District shall not discriminate in school-sponsored food service programs on the basis of sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
