Recognizing the purpose and effects of literary forms and techniques, as well as developing and sharpening personal writing skills will be emphasized. Students will also hone critical thinking, reading and speaking skills.

Course Objectives:

- To promote a strong understanding of and an appreciation for literature
- To identify and understand literary techniques and elements employed by writers
- To identify major forms of literature and understand their elements
- To develop writing skills for focused, insightful, supported and organized essays
- To guide students in becoming skilled listeners and communicators

- Read and/or complete assigned work before coming to class
- Be prepared to discuss the assigned material. I expect you to not only answer questions about the material, but to have a point of view and raise questions as well.
- Listen to, analyze, and respect ideas from other students.
- Be willing to help others and to be helped.
