Beginner Band at the Bonduel Schools Explained

The School District of Bonduel offers beginning band starting at fifth grade. In our School District, band is offered to our students as part of our curriculum and school day. Each student receives a weekly group lesson and some band experience.

Everyone has the potential to play a musical instrument; however, it will take varying effort based upon the individual and practice. Each student needs to practice regularly, 15 minutes each day is a great, however, any amount is a start. Also, it is very important that the students have parental support and encouragement. There will be times when your child may need a push in the right direction to keep them on track. Band is a wonderful experience in a team program in which everyone participates.

Band teaches our students many valuable concepts, such as, responsibility, discipline, abstract thought, spatial reasoning, love and understanding of music, an understanding of other cultures, creativity, expression of feelings and emotions, etc.

Some frequently asked questions about band.

- 1. How much will it cost? Music stores have rent and rent to own programs; you can borrow instruments from family members or rent from the school. There are options. Please do not let money make the decision. I will do everything in my power to allow access for your child.
- 2. Which instrument is the easiest to learn? They are all easy, if you want to learn and practice, each child is different.
- 3. Do you have to stay on the same instrument once you start? We can change instruments if we see the need. Sometimes the first choice is not always the best choice. However, we cannot switch repetitively. We need to spend time on an instrument to truly get comfortable.
- 4. Will it be noisy or even hard to listen to? Yes, it may. Please be supportive and encouraging. It will get better. Help your student find a regular time and place to practice. This will insure improvement.
- 5. Will I be able to be in sports and band? Yes, trust me. We work it out.
- 6. We cannot decide which instrument is right for our child. I will help decide if necessary.

The Band is made up of several instrument families:

- 1. <u>Woodwinds</u> = Most of this family of instruments uses a reed/s to create sound. The reed vibrates from the air that we blow across it. They also use keys to change pitch (notes).
 - Oboe
 - Flute
 - Clarinet
 - Bass Clarinet
 - Bassoon
 - Alto Sax
 - Tenor Sax
 - Baritone Sax

- 2. Brass = This family of instruments uses a mouthpiece and our lips to create sound. Our lips vibrate or buzz into the mouthpiece and these instruments use valves or slides to change pitches (notes).
 - Trumpet/Cornet
 - French Horn
 - Trombone
 - Baritone/Euphonium
 - Tuba
- 3. Percussion = This family of instruments is struck, shaken, or even scraped to produce sound.
 - Snare Drum
 - Bells
 - Cymbals
 - Bass Drum
 - Xylophone
 - Maracas
 - Timpani
 - Marimba
 - Etcetera

- 1. borrowed from a friend or family member.
- or rented/purchased from a reputable music store. If the price is too good to be true, it
 probably is not a good instrument. Many chain discount stores and online companies are
 offering cheap poor-quality instruments DO NOT buy them. I have included a list of

The BES students will have been exposed to most of the instruments of the band through performances by the BHS Band. This year we will have the opportunity to "tryout" the instruments during the school day. Hopefully, your future musicians will be able to select several instruments of interest through these opportunities. Also, I have included a video presentation by The United States Army Field Band: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CCTeSjpDsls Remember several choices are needed because we are striving for a well-rounded band.

If you have rented your instrument from a music store, they will provide a bottle of valve oil and/or a few reeds. My suggestion is that students purchase a box of reeds before summer lessons (IMC has an online ordering system). A box of reeds should last until the winter season. As beginners we use Rico reeds at 2 ½ strength. The music store, IMC visits our school during the school year regularly for your convenience. At no time are you obligated to patronize IMC. You have your choice of music stores, however, please check prices and quality of merchandise (i.e., cheap reeds through an online store). I have an online lesson book and I will print a copy for each student.
